3.2.9 PRADHAN MANTRI SWASTHYA SURAKSHAYOJANA(PMSSY)

The Pradhan Mantri Swasthya Swasthya Suraksha Yojana (PMSSY) aims to correct regional imbalances in the availability of affordable/reliable tertiary healthcare services and also to augment facilities for quality medical education in the country. PMSSY is a Central Sector Scheme and, has two components:

A. Setting up of All India Institute of Medical Sciences (AIIMS) institutions; and

B. Upgrading existing Government Medical Colleges/Institutions in a phased manner.

The objective is to establish AIIMS as centres of excellence that can provide quality medical education and nursing education along with tertiary health care facilities to the people.

Budgetary provisions

Budget Estimate (BE) and Revised Estimates(RE) for PMSSY for the financial Year (FY) 2023-24 is Rs.10,200.00 Crore and Rs. 8635.00 Crore respectively. From FY 2023-24, the establishment expenditure of new AIIMS has been separated from the PMSSY scheme and placed under the new Head "Establishment expenditure of new AIIMS". Accordingly, the budget of the PMSSY has been divided into 2 components.

Six AIIMS under Phase – I: In Phase-I, a total of six AIIMS (Bhopal, Bhubaneswar, Jodhpur, Patna, Raipur and Rishikesh) were set up at an approved cost of Rs. 820.00 crore per AIIMS. These are fully operational.

All key hospital facilities and services such as Emergency, Trauma, Blood bank, ICU, Diagnostic and Pathology are functioning. The total bed capacity of the six AIIMS is at present 6280. Hospital services in these 6 AIIMS are operating in various Specialities and Super- Specialties Departments. The basket of services has been expanded and presently, approximately 10051620 patients(01.04.2023 to 31.03.2024) visited OPD besides another 500464 patients (01.04.2023 to 31.03.2024) got treatment in IPD.

During the year 2023-24 six AIIMS have been dedicated to the Nation/ Inaugurated/dedicated to the nation by Hon'ble Prime Minister. These AIIMS are- AIIMS Guwahati , AIIMS Raebareli, AIIMS Kalyani, AIIMS Bathinda, AIIMS Mangalagiri , AIIMS Rajkot and AIIMS Vijaypur (Jammu) . In addition foundation stone of AIIMS Bibinagar and AIIMS Majra(Rewari) was also laid by Hon'ble Prime Minister during the year 2023-24.

Jan-Aushdhi Kendra has been opened in various AIIMS to ensure access to quality medicines for all sections of the population especially the poor and the deprived ones. 10,000th Jan Aushadhi Kendra was opened at AIIMS Deoghar during the current year.

Upgradation of Existing State Government Medical Colleges/ Institutions (GMCI) under PMSSY

The upgradation programme broadly envisages improving tertiary health infrastructure through construction of Super Specialty Blocks/ Trauma Care Centres etc. and/or procurement of medical equipment for existing Government Medical Colleges/Institution (GMCIs). Upgradation of GMCIs generally leads to addition of 8-10 Super Specialty Departments and 150-250 hospital beds. The project expenditure is shared between Centre and State. The present (Average) Centre - State sharing ratio is 60:40.

75 Projects for upgradation of GMCIs have been approved under different phases of PMSSY. Out of total 75 GMC upgradation projects approved under PMSSY, 65 Projects have been completed till 31-3-2024 adding about 14700 Super-specialty beds including 2547 ICU beds.

The upgraded facilities in the following GMCs were inaugurated during the Financial Year 2023-24:
